- 9. What was placed strategically around his body? Linear tattoos.
- 10. What gave the researchers the proof that this man was accustomed to manual labour? Examination of his hands and nails.
- 11. From which material was the axe, which they found next to him, made? Copper.
- 12. What was the bow covered with? Why (2 reasons)? Fat. To maintain its spring and keep it moist against the cold.
- 13. What kind of kits did Ötzi have? A kit for making thin tools and a kit for making fires.
- 14. Why did he have moss with him? Probably to use it as toilet paper.
